Executive summary

The overall objective of the project for "Addressing Transboundary Concerns in the Volta River Basin and its Downstream Coastal Area" is to enhance the ability of the riparian countries to plan and manage the Volta River Basin and its downstream coastal area (including aquatic resources and ecosystems) on a sustainable basis, by achieving sustainable capacity and establishing regional institutional frameworks for effective management; developing national and regional priorities; effective legal, regulatory and institutional frameworks and management tools as a basis for action, as well as initiating national and regional measures to achieve sustainable ecosystem management.

In view of this, the project is pursuing the following specific objectives:

- Build capacity, improve knowledge and enhance stakeholders' involvement to support the effective management of the VRB;
- Develop river basin legal, regulatory and institutional frameworks and management instruments for addressing transboundary concerns in the Volta River Basin and its downstream coastal area;
- Demonstrate national and regional measures to combat transboundary environmental degradation in the Volta Basin.

The GEF Volta project implementation, despite the review of the initial document (project logframe, activities, work plan, budget and institutional framework) and challenges encountered during the inception period, is very much on course based upon the approved work plan. The main challenges in the implementation of the project activities during the first year consist of the delays in feedbacks from national partners and in reports submission by the consultants. The project work plan and budget have undergone a number of revisions in order to address changes required and to keep it abreast with ongoing processes.

Over the past one year, attempts have been made to strengthen the established partnerships with institutions and organizations from within and outside of the project region. Apart from this, strengthened partnerships and representation at both the regional and international meetings have also increased the regional and international visibility of the project.

Most of the planned project activities are in the process of implementation. During the year, activities related to the identification/analysis of national institutions, ongoing/planned initiatives and collaboration opportunities, stakeholder involvement plan and training gaps were initiated. Many of the studies were launched at the national and regional levels and reports have been prepared by consultants and reviewed by the PMU. These studies are expected to substantially contribute to the planned revision of the initial project Transboundary Diagnostic Analysis (TDA), and the development of Strategic Action Plan (SAP) and Action Plans for National Part of the Volta River Basin (APNP-VRB) among other anticipated thematic outputs required for the project.

The development of a data management and information exchange strategy was launched with the study focusing on the inventory and analysis of existing data and information at national and regional levels, including the identification of training gaps and prioritisation of training needs for data management and monitoring.

The GEF Volta Project also launched the review and situation analysis of the proposed three demonstration projects in order to ensure that they are in agreement with the wishes of the stakeholders especially the potential beneficiaries, and realities in the field before the commencement of their implementation.

A major study has been conducted to review the preliminary TDA and the development of a detailed methodology for the preparation of the revised TDA and SAP documents. In the attempt to build the national partners' capacity and also prepare them for the planned TDA/SAP development, the project organised the regional TDA/SAP training workshop for national and key project partners on the TDA/SAP development process. The successful training workshop helped to build partners capacity with the aim of getting them to appreciate the procedures and requirements to be anticipated during the



revision of TDA and the development of SAP.

As detailed in this Annual Report, the progress towards achieving the immediate GEF Volta project objectives is satisfactory. It is expected that the anticipated outcomes of the project will be adequately achieved as earlier envisaged.

1.1 Overall objective(s) of the Project

- 1. The UNEP/GEF Volta River Basin Project is a regional initiative designed to facilitate the integrated management, sustainable development and protection of natural resources of the Volta River Basin within the six riparian countries of Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mali and Togo. It is developed specifically to address priority regional transboundary issues and problems as identified through a preliminary Transboundary Diagnostic Analysis (TDA) prepared during the project development phase. The Project has a primary focus on addressing some of the major environmental problems and issues of the basin leading to the degradation of the environment by human activities.
- 2. **Project's long-term goal:** equitable and sustainable management of water resources and other connected natural resources in the Volta River Basin and its downstream coastal area.
- 3. The project's overall objective is to enhance the ability of the riparian countries to plan and manage the Volta River Basin and its downstream coastal area (including aquatic resources and ecosystems) on a sustainable basis, through enhanced capacity building and established regional institutional frameworks for effective management; developing national and regional priorities and effective legal, regulatory and institutional frameworks including management tools as a basis for action, as well as initiating national and regional measures to achieve sustainable ecosystem management.
- 4. **The broad development objective** of this project is to address the perceived major transboundary problems and issues of the Volta Basin causing the degradation of the environment as a result of human activities, by reducing those activities that lead to water scarcity, land and water degradation, and to integrate environmental concerns with present and future development of the basin. The broad development objectives are in line with the WSSD recommendations, national IWRM planning processes, and national development and poverty reduction strategies.
- 5. The three Specific Objectives of the project are as follows:
- Specific Objective n° 1: Build capacity, improve knowledge and enhance stakeholders' involvement to support the effective management of the VRB
- Specific Objective n° 2: Develop river basin legal, regulatory and institutional frameworks and management instruments for addressing transboundary concerns in the Volta River Basin and its downstream coastal area
- Specific Objective n° 3: Demonstrate national and regional measures to combat transboundary environmental degradation in the Volta Basin.



1.2 Partners and Financial details (budget)

- 6. The UNEP GEF Volta Project is implemented by the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). The executing agency is the United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS) and UNEP DHI Centre for Water and Environment (UDC) as co-executing agency. The roles of these institutions are mentioned in the project inception reports as approved by the Project Steering committee meeting held in Bamako, Mali on 15th May, 2008.
- 7. The project has discussed and negotiated partnership arrangements with several institutions and organisations. Specifically, discussions have been held with VBA, IUCN-PAGEV, SIAAP, IW-LEARN, GEF Niger River, GEF-Senegal River, ECOWAS/WRCC, OMVG, OMVS, NBA and GWP-WAWP on possible areas to collaborate. During the discussion with some of these partners (mainly SIAAP, VBA, IUCN-PAGEV, GWP-WAWP) MOAs or collaboration agreements have been proposed towards the execution of key projects activities within the 2009 project work plan. These commitments will be captured as co-financing contributions as soon as the MOAs or such collaboration agreements are finalised during the forthcoming year.
- 8. The main financial partners are the Global Environment Facility (GEF) and the Governments of the riparian countries, contributing US\$ 5,844,880 and US\$ 3,424,739 respectively. Countries participating in the Project are Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mali and Togo. Project activities in these participating countries are coordinated by the National Focal Points.
- 9. Activities at national level are undertaken by the National partners from the six riparian countries, based upon the MOA signed with UNOPS and the agreed project work plan and budget. However, during the reporting year, mobilising the co-financing from some of the national partners and other project partners as stated in the initial project brief have remained very difficult¹.

2. Project Status

2.1 Information on the delivery of the Project activities

Status of implementation activities corresponding to Specific Objective n° 1 2.1.1

- 10. The project implementation started by the inception phase with the following key achievements. The Project Management Unit (PMU) was established at the premises of the Water Resources Commission (WRC - Accra Ghana), as part of Ghana's co-financing to the project and; its staff consisting of one Regional Coordinator (Mr. Hubert Onibon), one Scientific and Information Officer (Mr. Olumide Akinsola), one Administrative Assistant (Mrs. Abigail Sackar) and one Project Bilingual Secretary (Mrs. Angelika Quaye) were recruited. In January and February 2008, an inception mission was conducted in the riparian countries to introduce the project to high level authorities of the riparian countries, collect additional information, identify collaboration opportunities and present and discuss with regional/national partners on the following: i-) preliminary findings of the inception phase, ii-) issues relating to the project logframe, work plan, activities, and budget, iii-) institutional framework and iv-) collaboration opportunities.
- 11. Based on discussions with national partners on the project management and coordination arrangements, the Project Steering Committee has been established and National Institutional Focal Points (NIFP⁴) nominated by Governments. National Implementation Committees (NIC) have also been established and are functional. Also, a full-time staff has been recruited as National Operational Focal Point (NOFP) in each riparian country. Even though their recruitments have

been delayed by countries' administrative procedures, the 6 NOFP appointed by national authorities are providing support to the National Project Coordinators to manage, on a day-to-day basis the project activities at the country level. The effectiveness of their contribution is monitored by the PMU through the submission of monthly reports approved by the National Project Coordinators.

- 12. MOUs were signed with the 6 riparian countries to facilitate the implementation of the project activities at national level. The MOU scope covers the salary of NOFP, NIC meetings, validation of reference documents and consultancy reports, computer hardware and accessories, etc. The signing process was extremely complicated and delayed by long discussions and negotiations on national contributions (cash and kind). For example, some countries like Côte d'Ivoire and Togo felt that their current financial situation did not allow them to honour the co-finance commitments that were originally pledged to the project. It is important to highlight however that, apart from the financial contribution (cash and kind) received from Ghana for both the establishment of the PMU office and the field visit for the review of the Demonstration Project 3, cash contributions pledged by other riparian countries are not effective. Upon the PMU request, the Director of UNEP/DGEF has officially contacted Ministers in charge of environment of each of the 6 riparian countries in order to mobilise national contributions. In addition to that, the PMU has undertaken without success several discussions with national partners at different levels. This issue will be further addressed at the next PSC meeting.
- 13. Discussions regarding contractual modalities for DHI Center for Water and Environment to provide technical support to the PMU were delayed and drawn out. This contributed to the delay in the finalisation of the TORs for the Project Task Force (PTF) Members and their recruitment. The six regional experts jointly selected on competitive basis by UNEP and PMU, and appointed in September 2008 have provided the following specific technical support to the PMU: review of TORs prepared by the PMU for different studies, assessment of proposals submitted by different candidates, review of consultants' reports and participation to key workshops upon PMU request. Nevertheless, it is quite important to state here that the technical assistance to the PMU is weak and should be strengthened.
- 14. One of the major products of the reporting period is the preparation of the Project Inception Report, including the review of the project brief (logframe, activities, work plan, budget, institutional framework) and the preparation of the project monitoring and evaluation plan in consultation with national and regional institutions/stakeholders and UNEP/DGEF. The project document has been actualised by taking into account developments which occurred after the submission of the project to GEF (signature of the Volta Basin Convention, establishment of the Volta Basin Authority, implementation of IUCN/PAGEV Project, etc).
- 15. The Inception report, including the revised project brief was discussed and approved by the Project Steering Committee during its first meeting held in Bamako, Mali on 13th-15th May 2008. The meeting was attended by Government officials (National Institutional Focal Points for the Project) as well as representatives of the Implementing Agency UNEP/DGEF, the Executing agencies UNOPS and the UNEP Collaborating Centre (UCC), and the Volta Basin Authority (Figure 1). Representatives of Non-Governmental Organizations and Research Institutions as well as representatives of the project partners and government technical services in Mali also attended the meeting as observers.
- 16. In view of the plan to strengthen national institutions capabilities, facilitate local stakeholders participation to the project activities and contribute to the establishment of the Volta Basin Observatory, 3 main studies were initiated both at national and regional levels with the following achievements:
- In the study relating to the analysis of National Institutions including ongoing/planned initiatives
 the main activities, mandates, institutional frameworks, weakness, strength and training needs of
 national/regional institutions involved or likely to be involved in the implementation of the GEF
 Volta Project, their concerns, perceptions and reactions to transboundary issues and the project



activities are presented and analysed and a training plan proposed. The study also offered the opportunity to gather additional information, identify links and propose a collaboration plan with ongoing/planned initiatives at national and regional levels. In view of this, links have been established with the following UNEP/GEF Volta Project outputs:

- o Appropriation of TDA, SAP and associated documents by VBA
- Establishment of project database and VBA Observatory
- o Development and application of hydrological and hydrodynamic models
- o Training of national staff and awareness creation
- o Implementation of three Demo projects
- o Stakeholders' involvement
- The study relating to relating to the establishment of Regional Information and Data Exchange Mechanism in the Volta River Basin is focussed on: i-) the Inventory and analysis of existing national/regional data and information on the Volta river basin, including institutional analysis and training gaps, ii-) the setting up of a mechanism for the circulation of data and information at national and regional levels
- For the study on the development of the stakeholders' involvement plan, only 2 of the 6 national consultants have completed their report as per the TORs. This did not allow the regional consultant to complete his report during the reporting period and therefore it is expected that the consultants would complete their reports during the first quarter of the year 2009.
- 17. As indicated in Table 2, there is a delay in the submission of reports by some national consultants. This is mainly due to the lack of coordination/monitoring of national studies at the national level and also due to the competence of some consultants appointed by national partners to deliver on the assignment as stated in the TOR.
- 18. During the reporting period, the project activities and reports were widely disseminated through: the project website, project leaflet, preparation and presentation of the project at different international and regional meetings and also during courtesy visits to project partners as presented in Table 2 and Annex 3.

2.1.2 Status of implementation activities corresponding to Specific Objective n • 2

- 19. The specific objective 2 of the project aims to finalize and agree on the final, geographically specific, quantitative TDA, and contribute to the development of Strategic Action Programme (SAP) and Action Plan for the National Part of the VRB (APNP-VRB) that address issues of priority transboundary concerns. A transboundary diagnostic analysis is an important tool/approach that GEF has adopted towards the development of a Strategic Action Programme.
- 20. To ensure the success of the TDA/SAP process, it was recommended that project partners be trained in the approach and methodology of TDA and SAP development and processes, taking into consideration the peculiar situation in the Volta River basin. In view of this, a training session was organised in Cotonou, Benin from 15 to 19 September 2008 with the participation of key representatives of the project from the 6 riparian countries (Benin, Burkina Faso, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Mali and Togo): National Project coordinators, National Operational Focal Points, Project Task Force members, Project Management Unit staff, UNEP DHI Centre representatives and other stakeholders established in Benin (Figure 2). The training equally provided an opportunity for knowledge exchange and establishment of network between the GEF-Volta Project partners. The training made use of the modules developed by GEF-IW.
- 21. A preliminary TDA for the Volta River Basin was completed in 2002 and served as the basis for preparation of the project document and follow up inception report guiding the project implementation. The GEF Volta Project is therefore expected to update and expand the TDA, and also develop a regionally agreed SAP, following clarification of some aspects of the environmental status of the region as well as building grounds for SAP implementation. The preliminary TDA identifies a number of shortcomings, notably the lack of adequate data and information for several areas of assessment. Moreover, changes in the legal and institutional landscape have occurred since 2002, both at basin as well as at national level. Therefore, a review of the preliminary TDA has been carried out during the reporting period with the following results: identification and provision of recommendations for TDA gaps fillings, detailed methodology for TDA finalisation and SAP development including work plan and TORs for TDA and SAP experts both at national and regional levels.

2.1.3 Status of implementation activities corresponding to Specific Objective n • 3

- 22. During the project preparation phase, 3 demonstration projects were selected based on indications given by UNEP DGEF and corresponding project brief developed accordingly. The quick assessment of the 3 demonstration project documents conducted at the beginning of the overall project inception phase showed some incoherence mainly in terms of programming. In order to ensure good implementation of the 3 Demo Projects, consultants were recruited on a competitive basis to review and update the project documents (see Table 4).
- 23. During the review process, field visits were conducted to demo project areas and this created opportunities for exchange of information within government authorities and other key stakeholders of the project (national institutions concerned, decentralised communities, NGOs and Civil Society). The field visits and discussion with key stakeholders also reinforced the analyses already conducted on the environmental problems during the PDF-B phase, taking into account recent development in the proposed demo project areas, especially: i-) equipment of the Sourou river with hydrometric and rain gauge station through the implementation of the Volta HYCOS Project (Demo Project 1), ii-) the construction of wastewater network in the City of Kara with the support of SIAAP (Demo Project 2) and, iii-) the construction of the hydroelectric dam at Bui in Ghana (Demo Project 3).
- 24. The 3 studies led to the preparation of detailed Demo project documents including: i-) baseline situation analysis, ii-) feasibility, study, iii-) redefinition of objectives and expected outcomes, iv-) review of objectively verifiable indicators, demo project activities, work plan, budget, v-) institutional arrangements and implementation strategy. The draft reports prepared by the consultants have been reviewed by PMU, PTF and National Partners, and comments sent to consultants for consideration. The reports have been updated accordingly and the report validation workshops are planned for the fist quarter of the year 2009. The completion of the 3 studies were delayed by lack of coordination/feedback from national partners, non-mobilisation of national contributions for the field visits phase and difficulty in accessing available data and information
- 25. Furthermore, key project partners have been contacted as potential executing agencies (see Table 4). Discussions are still going on and final decision will be made jointly with in consultation with implementing and executing partners after the validation workshops

3. Report on changes/delays in project delivery and remedial action

- 27. The inception report of the GEF-Volta Project, including revised project logframe, activities, work plan, budget and institutional framework was finalised during the reporting period and key findings were discussed during the 1st Project Steering Committee (PSC) meeting held in Bamako, Mali from 13 to 15 May 2008. Based upon these discussions, a number of responses to the issues raised were agreed upon and recommendations made where applicable, including:
- appointment of consultants for the baseline situation analysis and the review of project documents for the demonstration projects,
- guidelines on reporting and monitoring method of the cash and in-kind co-financing from partners and participating countries
- development of clear mechanisms in order to give a material and methodological support to the National Institutional Focal Points and the National Implementation Committees to enable them to successfully fulfil their functions within the project
- need for riparian countries to ratify the Volta basin convention
- preparation of cost analysis of project travel in the region with the justification for the purchase of a vehicle for project partners' consideration
- detailed information on ongoing and planned national and regional initiatives and projects that have direct or indirect linkages to the activities of the UNEP/GEF Project
- additional resources to be sought for implementing the joint demonstration project Ghana-Togo on the preservation of coastal aquifers from salinisation, which was not included in the final project document
- appointment of 6 regional experts as Project Task Force to help the PMU with specific activities
- 28. Further details on specific problems encountered, and action taken to solve them have been presented in sections 2.1 and 2.2. Nevertheless, the main bottleneck of the reporting period are due
- delay in finalising the agreement between UNEP and UNEP DHI Centre which impacts on the finalisation of the project inception report, the recruitment of project task force members, the recruitment of consultants for the review of demonstration projects, the organisation of training of TDA/SAP process for National coordinators and National Operational Focal Points
- delay in the submission of reports by consultants and lack of coordination/ feedback from national partners on specific issues as presented in Tables 2, 3 and 4,
- non mobilisation of national co-finance contribution as pledged by Governments of riparian countries during the PDF-B phase and confirmed during the inception period.

4. Financial report

- 29. The detailed financial report presented in Table 8 has been prepared by the Executing Agency (UNOPS) and submitted in a separate report to UNEP/DGEF. The total amount spent during the year 2008 is 730,991.28\$ while the total budget for the same year was estimated at 1,470,862.8\$. This is mainly due to the fact that the budget was approved late and also to the delay in signing MOAs with riparian countries and agreement with UDC as planned. Some of the activities planned for 2008 had to be postponed to 2009 (development of training modules, development of project database, etc.).
- 30. In addition to the above, the demonstration projects didn't start as planned. This is due to the need for the PMU to conduct a deep review of each demonstration project as recommended by the PSC in May 2008 about five months after the submission of the budget to the UNEP DGEF. About 300,000\$ was supposed to be transferred to project partners in the framework of MOAs for the implementation of demonstration projects and technical support to the project.



31. Also the changes in the US dollar value affected the salaries of PMU national staff, the payment of national consultants in local currency (CFA and Cedis) and the procurement of office equipment as well as workshops and travel costs.
