Flood Management and Mitigation Programme (FMMP)

The MRC's Flood Management and Mitigation Programme (FMMP) aims to prevent, minimise, or mitigate people's suffering and economic losses due to floods, while preserving the environmental benefits of floods.

The FMMP has five major components:

- 1. Establishment of a Regional Flood Management and Mitigation Centre
- 2. Structural Measures and Flood Proofing
- 3. Mediation of Transboundary Flood Issues
- 4. Flood Emergency Management Strengthening
- 5. Land Management.

4. FLOOD EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT STRENGTHENING

Project details

Flood Emergency Management Strengthening is being implemented by the Mekong River Commission (MRC) in collaboration with the Asian Disaster Preparedness Center (ADPC), with funding support from Deutsche Gesellschaft für Technische Zusammenarbeit (GTZ) GmbH.

Development Objective

To improve the competence of civil authorities at various levels, emergency managers and communities in flood preparedness and mitigation.

Project Objective

To see emergency management systems in the riparian countries dealing more effectively with Mekong floods. Project Duration September 2004 to June 2007

Partner Countries

Cambodia, Lao PDR, Thailand and Viet Nam (MRC member countries) with a special focus on Cambodia and Viet Nam

Pilot Provinces

Kandal & Prey Veng provinces, Cambodia An Giang & Dong Thap provinces, Vietnam.

Component 4: Outputs & Activities

Output 1 To facilitate preparation and implementation of flood preparedness plans in selected provinces and districts in Cambodia and Viet Nam.

Activities:

- Organise and conduct training courses/workshops for selected provinces in Cambodia and Viet Nam.
- Strengthen the capacity of provincial disaster management offices of each pilot province and district disaster management offices in two districts in each province.
- Provide support to planning and development of flood preparedness programs in these provinces and districts.
- Distribute flood preparedness program documents, maps and forecasts to districts and communes in the pilot provinces.
- Support priority sub-projects including needs-based local level training courses of community leaders in community based flood management (eg safe area management, forecast boards, emergency kindergartens).
- Support the improved management of stockpiles and warehouses of selected districts of pilot provinces in Cambodia and Viet Nam.
- Support the mobilisation of sub-national/local budgetary resources for program implementation in the pilot provinces.

Output 2: Further develop national capacities in Cambodia and Viet Nam to support preparation and implementation of flood preparedness plans.



Activities:

- Support the preparation and issue of national guidelines and manuals by national disaster management offices and National Mekong Committees of Cambodia and Viet Nam for preparation of provincial and district flood preparedness programs.
- Support the gradual takeover by national agencies of the delivery of training courses in flood preparedness planning at the provincial and district levels.
- Develop institutional capacity in national disaster management offices of Cambodia and Viet Nam and other relevant agencies to provide technical support at provincial and district levels in preparing flood preparedness programs.

Output 3: Conduct flood risk awareness campaigns in two districts of each pilot province.

Activities:

- Adapt (language, cultural content) and republish booklets and posters and distribute through appropriate channels.
- Review possibilities/co-financing arrangements for using/adapting the film Living with Floods.
- Organise/facilitate training for children through school teachers and distribution of materials for adults through appropriate channels in the pilot provinces.

Output 4: Facilitate regional knowledge sharing.

Activities:

- Conduct and organise two regional workshops.
- Prepare and circulate good practice documents in Khmer and Vietnamese.
- Organise a study tour for provincial level officials of pilot provinces in Cambodia and Viet Nam to other Riparian countries.

Output 5: Facilitate preparation for Cambodia and Viet Nam province-to-province transboundary emergency assistance.

Activities:

- Support cooperation between selected neighbouring provinces along the Cambodia, Viet Nam and Lao-Thailand border.
- Facilitate the preparation of concrete transboundary emergency preparedness tools, such as maps and joint training.
