

Regional Training on the Legal Implementation of the Ballast Water Management Convention with particular emphasis on Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement

AIDE MEMOIRE

BACKGROUND/INTRODUCTION

The training is part of the IMO's Technical Cooperation Programme being implemented through SPREP.

The training is to strengthen national and regional capacity for an effective implementation of the Convention on the Control and Management of Ships' Ballast Water and Sediments through a legal and Compliance Monitoring and Enforcement training course.

TRAINING OBJECTIVE

The objectives of this training are:

- To strengthen national and regional capacity for an effective implementation of the BWM Convention
- To discuss in detail steps required to develop national legislation with the assistance of a model BWM act
- To discuss in detail the compliance monitoring and enforcement aspects including port state control measures

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• To develop a regionally harmonized CME regime for the Pacific Islands

TRAINING OUTCOMES

The outcomes are:

- Regional and National capacity strengthened and effectively implementing the BWM Convention
- Standardised regional approach for the ballast water management
- Growing network of regional and national institutes that can provide further training using the GloBallast training tools
- Early ratification and implementation of the BWM Convention in the region.

Duration of the course will be 3days from Monday 16 May up to and including Wednesday 18 May 2011. The venue will be at the Pasifika Conference Room, SPC Ratu Mara Road, Nabua, Suva Fiji.

NOMINATIONS

Governments invited by SPREP to participate in this training are invited to nominate two (2) persons for the training.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION

Course will be delivered in the English language.

TRAVEL AND ACCOMMODATION

SPREP will sponsor a maximum of two (2) delegates from each participating country traveling from outside the host country. These countries are *Cook Islands, Micronesia (Federated States of), Fiji. Kiribati ,Marshall Islands, Niue, Nauru, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Vanuatu.* Unfortunately the SPREP/IMO funding does not extend to the territories *American Samoa, Commonwealth of Northern Marianas. French Polynesia, Guam, New Caledonia, Tokelau, Wallis and Futuna* therefore participation in these courses will be at these countries own cost.

Sponsoring consists of provision of the most direct, least cost, round trip economy class air transport, between the airport of departure in their home country and Suva Fiji as the training country and the daily subsistence allowance to cover the costs of accommodation, meals and other expenses.

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EXPENDITURE / INSURANCE TO BE BORNE BY PARTICIPANTS

SPREP will not assume responsibility for the following expenses:

- a. all expenses in the home country incidental to travel abroad, including expenditure for visa and passports, medical examination, inoculations and other such miscellaneous items and internal travel to and from the airport of arrival and departure in the home country;
- b. salary and related allowance for the participants during the period of the workshop;

- d. costs incurred by participants in respect of travel insurance, accident insurance, medical or dental bills or hospitalization fees in connection with their attending the workshop;
