# Value Island Biodiversity - it's our life:

Biodiversity can be defined as the "variety of life on Earth" and our Pacific is a unique area for both marine and land based biodiversity.

News entries must have been broadcast or published in at least one of the Pacific Island countries and territories that are SPREP members during the 12 month period from 1 January to 31 December 2010.

Open to Journalists residing in any of SPREP's island countries or territories.

Journalists can submit a maximum of three entries each.

Each entry must be accompanied by an entry form and submitted in triplicate.

### Prizes:

500 USD awarded for the winner of each category 500 USD awarded for best entry overall

#### **Requirements:**

- This award is open to journalists residing in any of SPREP's island member countries or territories.
- Submissions for the 2010 award will need to have been published or broadcast in at least one of the Pacific island countries and territories that are SPREP members during the 12 month period from 1 January to 31 December 2010.
- Applicants are limited to entering three stories each. You MUST submit three copies (in print, audio or digital format) of each article.
- Each entry must be accompanied by an entry form.
- Entries must reach SPREP by 14 January 2011. No extension to this period can be given.
  - An accurate translation of a transcript in English should be provided if the news item is presented in a different language.

• The jury will to comprise a member from the Roundtable for Nature Conservation, SPREP and the Pacific Islands News Assocation/PACNEWS.

- The judging process is confidential and decisions will be final.
  - SPREP reserves the right to reproduce prize wining entries.
