CHALLENGES*

Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) are an effective tool for providing lasting protection, enabling restoration and the sustainable use of the natural and cultural heritage of the Mediterranean to the benefit of coastal communities.

To achieve the international goal of protecting 10% of the Mediterranean ecoregion through the establishment of a coherent network of MPAs:

• more MPAs are needed,

• MPA management needs to be improved.

SOLUTIONS

WWF Mediterranean and its partners are implementing the **MedPAN South project** (2009-12) to address these challenges. The project will enhance and consolidate capacity in the countries of the south and east of the Mediterranean to establish new MPAs, better manage the existing ones and strengthen the MedPAN network* of MPA managers. The project focuses on two main areas of activity:

• **Pilot projects** on MPA design and management effectiveness in Algeria, Croatia, Libya, Tunisia and Turkey.

• **Capacity building programme** for MPA managers, practitioners and officers of relevant authorities in Albania, Algeria, Croatia, Egypt, Lebanon, Libya, Montenegro, Morocco, Syria, Tunisia and Turkey. * The MedPAN network brings together the managers of Mediterranean MPAs and supports them in their management activities.
