### 1.1 Why Basin Development Plan'

- 1995 Mekong Agreement
  - Article 2
  - Other Articles
- Promote Joint planning and Regional cooperation as core functions of International River Basin Organization like the MRC
- Common targets for poverty reduction by Member states and implications on water and related resources development
- Facilitate national development while protecting the vital ecosystem of the River



#### 1.2 The MRC BDP Programme

#### Development Objective:

The water resources of the Mekong River Basin managed and developed in an integrated, sustainable and equitable manner for the mutual benefits of the riparian States"

#### Objectives of Phase 1 (2001-2006):

- A participatory basin planning process established and ongoing
- A BDP aiming at a balanced mix of social, economic and environmental factors drafted and agreed on.



#### 1.3 Achievements of BDP Phase

- A participatory Basin planning process carried out in 5 stages
- Agreed "Strategic directions for IWRM in LMB"
- Sub-area analysis and National and Regional sector reviews
- A comprehensive MRC Project database
- An agreed shortlist of priority development initiatives
- Tools and routines for project identification, initial documentation and screening of impacts and significance, classification and ranking
- Qualified staff and relevant institutional capacities
- Emerging fruitful interaction with national planning process

## 1.4 Lessons learned from BDP Phase 1

- Sharpen the impact and institutional interfaces of the BDP
- Decision process vs. facilitating comprehensive influence of member countries and support of eventual outcome
- Scenario-based planning is not applied on routine basis within national development planning
- Further consolidation of Strategic environmental assessment with MRC Environment programme
- Strengthen the information flows on national and regional planning processes via and among the NMCs
- Enhance external participation in the planning process




### 2.1 Objectives of BDP Phase 2

- A rolling IWRM-based BDP produced in support of sustainable development in the Mekong River Basin
- Knowledge base and assessment tools further developed and utilized effectively in MRCS and NMCs
- Capacity built at MRC and NMC levels for IWRM planning and facilitation in situations where trade of management is required

#### What is the IWRM-based BDP?

- Provides a planning framework and transparency to water and related resources development in the Lower Mekong Basin that benefit all member states
- Brings all major on-going and planned water resources development projects and supporting nonstructural projects in the BDP process
- Enables the MRC to visibly engage in transboundary water governance based on IWRM
- Should be prepared with participation of stakeholders



#### 1<sup>st</sup> element - Development scenarios

- "What if" cases to present different levels of water resources development over next decades
- Requires all on-going, planned and proposed significant projects in water and related sectors
- Assessment of hydrological impacts using DSF
- Assessment of environmental, social and economic impacts, using IBFM and other tools
- Results will inform the IWRM-based Basin strategy





- Based on the basin-wide development scenarios jointly selected by member countries
- Provides clear directions and a planning framework to guide sustainable Basin development of LMB over the next two decades
- Provides a Basin management strategy that guides the implementation of IWRM at basin (regional), national and local (sub-area) levels
- Provides clear description of roles and responsibilities for the implementation of the Strategy




#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Element - Project portfolio

- List of water and related resources development projects and supporting non-structural projects for two objectives:
  - "To seek assistance for implementation at basin level"
  - ➤ To ensure MRC transboundary governance
- Project should be in line with the IWRM-based Basin strategy
- Projects should be both national and basin/regional priorities
- Priority ranking within the Project portfolio based on assessment with agreed criteria
