# **Essential Elements** of the Healthy

**Municipalities and Communities (HMC) Strategy** 

- 1. Build public **Commitment** by the mayor and municipal council, local government (key sectors), non-governmental and private sectors and the community
- 2. Ensure and strengthen **Community Participation** during planning, implementation, and evaluation
- 3. Develop a **Strategic Plan** that enhances community decision-making and facilitates overcoming obstacles. Included in this are provisions for mobilizing resources, especially human and infrastructural resources; securing adequate support and technical cooperation; and creating healthy and supportive environments in schools, workplaces, and other public places
- 4. **Build Consensus and form Partnerships** to create healthy and supportive environments. It is especially important to strengthen networks and projects comprised of a wide range of institutions and organizations, both within the health sector and with other sectors in order to build consensus for the establishment and maintenance of Healthy Municipalities and Communities
- 5. Encourage leadership and participation from **all Social Sectors including the Health Sector** as many health promotion strategies and activities extend beyond the capacity of the health sector alone
- 6. Formulate **Healthy Public Policies** at the local, regional, and national levels
- 7. Conduct ongoing **Monitoring and Evaluation** to track and assess progress of the Initiative, and to identify the intended and the unintended results

# Phases of the HMC Strategy Initial and Organizational Phase (1 to 3 months)

**Expected Outcome: an Approved Healthy Municipalities and Communities Strategic Plan** 

- ▶ Conduct a Participatory Community-Based Assessment
- ▶ Create an Intersectoral Municipal Committee and Develop an Overall Common Vision of HMC
- Develop a Proposed Strategic Plan with Objectives, Goals, Expected Results, and Targets, and Establish a Focal Point for HMC in the Municipal Council
- Gain Approval and Assign Resources for the Plan by the Municipal Council
- Discuss and Disseminate through a Public Forum

# Planning Phase (4 to 6 months)

Expected Outcome: HMC Working Group and Detailed Work Plan

- Designate Members of the Intersectoral Municipal Committee to be Part of a Working Group for Activity Implementation and Monitoring
- Develop a Detailed Work Plan with Activities, Assigned Responsibilities and Resources, a Timeline, and Indicators for Monitoring and Evaluation

Identify Strategies to Encourage Sustained Participation and Partnerships for the Implementation of the Plan and Resource Mobilization
