2. Specifications: statement of requirement

- 2.1. SPREP would like to call for tenders from qualified and experienced film makers or production houses who can offer their services to produce a documentary on Renewable Energy in the Pacific region, specifically a project in their country and the lessons learnt.
- 2.2. The successful applicant will need to provide a completed documentary by 28 March 2011.

3. Conditions: information for applicants

3.1. To be considered for this tender, interested suppliers must meet the following conditions: they must be based in the Pacific islands countries or territories, they must be experienced film makers, and their budget must contain reasonable costs.

4. Submission guidelines

- 4.1. Tender documentation should demonstrate that the interested supplier satisfies the conditions stated above and is capable of meeting the specifications and timeframes, and provide supporting examples to address the evaluation criteria. Further information is available on "Attachment Annex 1"
- 4.2. Tender documentation should outline the interested supplier's complete proposal: methods, personnel (and their skill sets / curricula vitae), timeframes and costs, please check "Attachment Annex 1" for full requirements for tender submission.

5. Evaluation criteria

- 5.1. SPREP will select a preferred supplier on the basis of SPREP's evaluation of the extent to which their tender documentation demonstrates that they offer the best value for money, and that they satisfy the following criteria.
- 5.2. Expertise and demonstrated experience in documentary production.
- 5.3. Realistic and reasonable budget costs

6. Deadline

- 6.1. The due date for submission of the tender is: 29 October 2010
- 6.2. Late submissions will be returned unopened to the sender.
