Introduction & Recommendations

- At the 2nd MSTP/ICC Meetings, Members approved the establishment of the Yellow Sea Grant Program (YSGP) to encourage active participation of NGOs in the project
- 2. The Secretariat calls on the MSTP/ICC members to review, provide guidance and approve the YSGP
- Upon approval, the PMO will request the International Financing Specialist to prepare the YSLME Partnership Trust Fund & financial rules and regulations, and
- 4. Request the Secretariat to start mobilizing resources to fully implement the YSGP

Background

Yellow Sea Grant Program was created **to support** non-for-profit organizations to contribute to achieving the 11 YSLME SAP targets









Specific Objectives

SUPPORT eligible non-for-profit social welfare organizations and community-based organizations

DEVELOP their resource mobilization, organizational development and management capacity

IMPROVE their overall capacity

To achieve enhanced awareness and on-the-ground impact for regionwide ecosystem-based management of the Yellow Sea

Grant Scale

Up to USD 100,000

Grant Cycle

Minimum 6 months (strict end date 30 November 2019)

Grant management

Managed by the Secretariat in accordance with YSLME Partnership Trust Fund and with approval of the MSTP/ICC








Eligible costs

- Manpower for experts or personnel labor
- Training, Seminar, workshops etc.
- Surveys
- Travel and lodging and meal during travel
- Goods or service necessary for achieving the objectives of the project
- Outreach and knowledge Products (including writing, printing brochures, establishing database, publish research report etc.,)
- Costs for project monitor and evaluation (including baseline survey, on-site inspections, date collection, meetings, discussions etc.,)
- Project administrative expenses (not more than 10%)
- Others costs agreed at the time of the signing of the grant agreement









- **25-30% reduction** in fishing effort
- **Rebuild** marine living resources
- **Improve** mariculture to reduce environmental stress
- Maintain and improve of current population and distribution of genetic diversity of living organisms including endangered and endemic species
- Habitat maintenance according to 2007 standards
- **Reduce** risks of introduced species
- Meet international requirements on contaminants
- Improve understanding and prediction of ecosystem changes for adaptive management
- **Reduce** nutrients from 2006 level
- Reduce marine litter
- Reduce contaminants in marine recreational waters






11 YSLME SAP Targets



YSGP Call Launch & Response




